Down to Business.....

The PC has set a precept for next year of £15,775 which is an increase of 12% over the previous year. The increase is largely due to an anticipated rise in the cost of maintaining the playing field and to an increase in the Clerk's hours and salary (which is set by a national body). The Councillors do not receive a salary and no one has claimed any expenses in recent years.

The PC has invited tenders for the playing field maintenance and will seek to obtain the best value for money. The Clerk's hours have to be increased to deal with extra planning applications and additional responsibilities being placed on the PC (see below for some examples). The PC also has to make provision for the long term maintenance of the Village Hall, Tennis Court and Children's Play Area - all of which were new at a similar time and are all getting older together!

The PC was asked to review the vision statement for the extension of the Norwich Research Park, which will include the construction of new roads and a new junction with the Watton Rd. No time-table for building has yet been seen.

Freedom of Information.

The PC is now required to publish a wide range of information on www.little-melton.org.uk . The information should be in place by the New Year. People without web access can request printed copies from the Clerk - please see front page for contact details.
