Precept 2011/2012

Parish Councils have been asked to maintain precepts at 2010 levels and Little Melton Parish Council has complied by keeping the precept unchanged for 2011. Because some items will increase in cost during 2011, the Parish Council has had to reduce the budget for maintenance of the Village Hall in order to balance the budget. Replacement of the remaining single glazed windows with more energy efficient units may have to be delayed by a year unless external funds can be found. Snow and Ice

At the time of writing there have been several weeks of icy conditions and it looks as if this winter may be colder than most. The Parish Council has secured an additional grit bin and it has been sited at the junction of Braymeadow Lane and School Lane.

Please take note that there are no funds to pay for regular clearance of ice from the Village Hall car park and care must be taken in icy weather. People are of course welcome to take grit out for use on the paths outside their properties but NOT for use on their own drives and paths.

Travellers on School Lane in Colney

Norfolk County Council evicted the travellers at the end of November as the travellers had not adhered to the conditions of their toleration. Norfolk County Council will be clearing the road in order to make it passable by walkers and cyclists.

The Parish Council has asked the Highway Rangers to clear the mud and vegetation from the path at the end of School Lane in Little Melton (by the A47).
