



Housing Developments

In January the South Norfolk Development Management Committee accepted if the Mill Rd/School Lane cross roads is repainted as a roundabout then previous objections to housing developments on Mill Rd are overcome. The PC Chair and our two SNC representatives all raised objections but the committee had little choice but to accept the Planning and Highways officers' recommendations to approve the applications, as unfortunately there is a deficit in the five year housing supply for the Greater Norwich Development area and this means that there is a presumption in favour of 'sustainable' development in this area. Exactly what is meant by 'sustainable' seems open to interpretation.

There was discussion at the Parish Meeting about the aspects of the development that we will have opportunity to influence—ie provision of public spaces, speed restriction on Mill Rd.
